ROMANS 2:17-29

Introduction:

1. CONFIDENCE OF THE RELIGIOUS MAN (VSS. 17-20)

Romans 2:17-20

Behold, thou art called a Jew, and restest in the law, and makest thy boast of God, [18] And knowest his will, and approvest the things that are more excellent, being instructed out of the law; [19] And art confident that thou thyself art a guide of the blind, a light of them which are in darkness, [20] An instructor of the foolish, a teacher of babes, which hast the form of knowledge and of the truth in the law.

- A. Boast of the lineage (17a)
 - 1. Lineage does not save.
 - 2. Location does not save.

- B. Boast of their law (17b)
 - 1. Religious activity does not save.
- C. Boast of their Lord (17c-18)
 - 1. They felt being religious and active was all that was necessary to please God.
- D. Boast of their leadership (19-20)

2. CONTAMINATION OF THE RELIGIOUS MAN (VSS. 21-22)

Romans 2:21-22

Thou therefore which teachest another, teachest thou not thyself? thou that preachest a man should not steal, dost thou steal? [22] Thou that sayest a man should not commit adultery, dost thou commit adultery? thou that abhorrest idols, dost thou commit sacrilege?

- A. Guilty of deception (21-22)
- B. Guilty of desecration (23)
- C. Guilty of destruction (24)

3. Condemnation Of The Religious Man (vs 25-29)

Romans 2:25-29

For circumcision verily profiteth, if thou keep the law: but if thou be a breaker of the law, thy circumcision is made uncircumcision. [26] Therefore if the uncircumcision keep the righteousness of the law, shall not his uncircumcision be counted for circumcision? [27] And shall not uncircumcision which is by nature, if it fulfil the law, judge thee, who by the letter and circumcision dost transgress the law? [28] For he is not a Jew, which is one outwardly; neither is that circumcision, which is outward in the flesh: [29] But he is a Jew, which is one inwardly; and circumcision is that of the heart, in the spirit, and not in the letter; whose praise is not of men, but of God.

- A. Condemned by the reality of his sin. (25)
- B. Condemned by the righteousness of the saint (26-29a)
- C. Condemned by the redemption of the Savior (29b)

Close:

There is a vast difference between a religious individual and a redeemed individual. That difference determines where an individual spends eternity.
