Text: Psalms 55:16

Psalms 55:16

¹⁶ As for me, I will call upon God; and the LORD shall save me.

Introduction:

Spurgeon once said, "I bear willing witness that I owe more to the fire, the hammer and the file than to anything else in the Lord's workshop. I sometimes question whether I have ever learned anything except through the rod. When my schoolroom is darkened, I see the most."

Do you ever battle discouragement? Sail stormy seas? Face giants greater then yourself? We all do! But, remember today that victory lies in the Lord Jesus Christ. In this passage, we are presented with a man whose own son had turned on him, whose best friends were trying to kill him, a man who felt very alone. A man who was sailing one of life's stormy seas.

Note:

1. DAVID'S DISCOURAGEMENT (VSS.1-4, 9-15)

Psalms 55:1-4

¹ Give ear to my prayer, O God; and hide not thyself from my supplication. ² Attend unto me, and hear me: I mourn in my complaint, and make a noise; ³ Because of the voice of the enemy, because of the oppression of the wicked: for they cast iniquity upon me, and in wrath they hate me. ⁴ My heart is sore pained within me: and the terrors of death are fallen upon me.

Psalms 55:9-15

⁹ Destroy, O Lord, *and* divide their tongues: for I have seen violence and strife in the city. ¹⁰ Day and night they go about it upon the walls thereof: mischief also and sorrow *are* in the midst of it. ¹¹ Wickedness *is* in the midst thereof: deceit and guile depart not from her streets. ¹² For *it was* not an enemy *that* reproached me; then I could have borne *it*: neither *was it* he that hated me *that* did magnify *himself* against me; then I would have hid myself from him: ¹³ But *it was* thou, a man mine equal, my guide, and mine acquaintance. ¹⁴ We took sweet counsel together, *and* walked unto the house of God in company. ¹⁵ Let death seize upon them, *and* let them go down quick into hell: for wickedness *is* in their dwellings, *and* among them.

A. He Felt Deserted (vs. 1-2)

B. He Felt Deceived (vs. 9-15; 20-21) - Ahithophel – He was angry with David because Bathsheba was his granddaughter.

²⁰ He hath put forth his hands against such as be at peace with him: he hath broken his covenant. ²¹ *The words* of his mouth were

smoother than butter, but war was in his heart: his words were softer than oil, yet were they drawn swords.

And when Ahithophel saw that his counsel was not followed, he saddled *his* ass, and arose, and gat him home to his house, to his city, and put his household in order, and hanged himself, and died, and was buried in the sepulchre of his father.

And it came to pass, after the year was expired, at the time when kings go forth *to battle*, that David sent Joab, and his servants with him, and all Israel; and they destroyed the children of Ammon, and besieged Rabbah. But David tarried still at Jerusalem. And it came to pass in an eveningtide, that David arose from off his bed, and walked upon the roof of the king's house: and from the roof he saw a woman washing herself; and the woman *was* very beautiful to look upon. And David sent and enquired after the woman. And *one* said, *Is* not this Bathsheba, the daughter of Eliam, the wife of Uriah the Hittite? And David sent messengers, and took her; and she came in unto him, and he lay with her; for she was purified from her uncleanness: and she returned unto her house.

- C. He Felt Dirty (vs. 4) Because of Uriah
- D. He Felt Defeated (vs. 5)

2. DAVID'S DESIRE (VS. 6-8)

Psalms 55:6-8

⁶ And I said, Oh that I had wings like a dove! *for then* would I fly away, and be at rest. ⁷ Lo, *then* would I wander far off, *and* remain in the wilderness. Selah. ⁸ I would hasten my escape from the windy storm *and* tempest.

- A. To Fly Away (vs. 6)
- B. To Flee Away (vs. 7)
- C. To Float Away (vs. 8)

The fact is no one can run from problems, we must face them with the help of the Lord.

3. David's Deliverance (vss. 16-23)

Psalms 55:16-23

¹⁶ As for me, I will call upon God; and the LORD shall save me. ¹⁷ Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray, and cry aloud: and he shall hear my voice. ¹⁸ He hath delivered my soul in peace from the battle *that was* against me: for there were many with me. ¹⁹ God shall hear, and afflict them, even he that abideth of old. Selah. Because they have no changes, therefore they fear not God. ²⁰ He hath put forth his hands against such as be at peace with him: he hath broken his covenant. ²¹ *The words* of his mouth were smoother than butter, but war *was* in his heart: his words were softer than oil, yet *were* they drawn swords. ²² Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved. ²³ But thou, O God, shalt bring them down into the pit of destruction: bloody and deceitful men shall not live out half their days; but I will trust in thee.

- C. Cast Away Burdens (vs. 22a)

D. Continue In Him (1 Cor. 15:58)

1 Corinthians 15:58

⁵⁸ Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord.

E. Consider Him (vs. 23)

Hebrews 12:1-2

¹ Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset *us*, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, ² Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of *our* faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.
