# Matthew 19:27

<sup>27</sup> Then answered Peter and said unto him, Behold, we have forsaken all, and followed thee; what shall we have therefore?

Introduction:

The Lord was talking to the rich young ruler about salvation, while the disciples were looking on. They saw him go away, and Peter ask, *"Behold, we have forsaken all, and followed thee; what shall we have therefore?"* 

So Jesus answered the disciples and Peter their spokesman in this parable.

This parable is a parable about service, not salvation.

# 1. THE STORY (MATT. 20:1-16)

# Matthew 20:1-16

For the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which went out early in the morning to hire labourers into his vineyard.<sup>2</sup> And when he had agreed with the labourers for a penny a day, he sent them into his vineyard.<sup>3</sup> And he went out about the third hour, and saw others standing idle in the marketplace, <sup>4</sup> And said unto them; Go ve also into the vineyard, and whatsoever is right I will give you. And they went their way.  $^{5}$  Again he went out about the sixth and ninth hour, and did likewise. <sup>6</sup> And about the eleventh hour he went out, and found others standing idle, and saith unto them, Why stand ye here all the day idle?<sup>7</sup> They say unto him, Because no man hath hired us. He saith unto them, Go ye also into the vineyard; and whatsoever is right, that shall ye receive. <sup>8</sup> So when even was come, the lord of the vineyard saith unto his steward, Call the labourers, and give them their hire, beginning from the last unto the first. <sup>9</sup> And when they came that were hired about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny. <sup>10</sup> But when the first came, they supposed that they should have received more; and they likewise received every man a penny. <sup>11</sup> And when they had received it, they murmured against the goodman of the house, <sup>12</sup> Saying, These last have wrought but one hour, and thou hast made them equal unto us, which have borne the burden and heat of the day. <sup>13</sup> But he answered one of them, and

# 2. THE APPLICATION

Again we must remember that this is a parable about service and not salvation for we do not earn our salvation, nor do we work for our salvation.

Note:

- A. Labors Are Needed
- The Lord has work to be done.

Illustration: 6 billion people in the world & most need to hear the gospel.

 The Problem Is Not a Lack of Work, but a Lack of Laborers • The Harvest Is Ready

### John 4:35

<sup>35</sup> Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white <u>already</u> <u>to harvest.</u>

The World at this Moment is at its Greatest Need

Note a second principle:

B. Looking At Others Will Always Be Harmful

#### Matthew 20:8-12

<sup>8</sup> So when even was come, the lord of the vineyard saith unto his steward, Call the labourers, and give them their hire, beginning from the last unto the first. <sup>9</sup> And when they came that were hired about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny. <sup>10</sup> But when the first came, they supposed that they should have received more; and they likewise received every man a penny. <sup>11</sup> And when they had received it, they murmured against the goodman of the house,

<sup>12</sup> Saying, These last have wrought but one hour, and thou hast made them equal unto us, which have borne the burden and heat of the day.

Note

Those Hired First Were Paid Last

They watched what those in front of them were paid.

They began to murmur and complain.

 We need to realize that everyone does not have the same opportunity.

Remember:

- Opportunity brings responsibility
- Ability brings accountability
- It's not equal giving, but equal sacrifice

Note a third principle:

C. The Lord Is Trustworthy (vs. 12-16)

#### Matthew 20:12-16

<sup>12</sup> Saying, These last have wrought but one hour, and thou hast made them equal unto us, which have borne the burden and heat of the day. <sup>13</sup> But he answered one of them, and said, Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst not thou agree with me for a penny? <sup>14</sup> Take that thine is, and go thy way: I will give unto this last, even as unto thee. <sup>15</sup> Is it not lawful for me to do what I will with mine own? Is thine eye evil, because I am good? <sup>16</sup> So the last shall be first, and the first last: for many be called, but few chosen.

- We need to give the Lord our all
- What shall we have in doing so

# Romans 8:32

<sup>32</sup> He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also <u>freely give us</u> <u>all things</u>?
