Introduction:

This text is one of the most amazing text in the Bible. It is a text that has brought comfort to many over the years. But this morning I would like to look at this text not from man's point of view but rather from Christ's.

We see from our text the longing desire down deep I the heart of our Savior which led Him to frequently and urgently sound this invitation, "Come Unto Me."

Notice with me this morning:

1. Who is HE

A. It is One Who has often been rejected.

John 1:11

He came unto his own, and his own received him not.

B. It is One Who had warned them of the dread of rejecting Him.

Matthew 11:21

Woe unto thee, Chorazin! woe unto thee, Bethsaida! for if the mighty works, which were done in you, had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes.

C. It is One Who has all power.

Matthew 11:27

All things are delivered unto me of my Father: and no man knoweth the Son, but the Father; neither knoweth any man the Father, save the Son, and he to whomsoever the Son will reveal him.

Matthew 28:18

And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.
