Introduction:

This chapter of the Bible has been referred to as "The lost and found department of the Bible"; "Lost sheep", "Lost Coin", and the "Lost Son.

B. Distorted Values (vs 29) "Never killed a kid for me"

C. Outraged Virtue (vs 29) "These many years have served Thee"

3. THE CURE OF SELF PITY

A. Abiding presence (vs 31)

B. Abundant Provision (vs 31) "all that I have is thine"

C. Achieved PurpOose (vs 32) main goal- to get the sinners saved.
