John 15:11 (KJV)

¹¹ These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and *that* your joy might be full.

Introduction:

1. THE CONDITION FOR JOY

A. Hear the Word of God. ("These things have I spoken.")

The truth of the Word of God brings freedom and joy into the heart of a Christian.

B. Heed the Word of God

Habakkuk 3:17-18 (KJV)

¹⁷ Although the fig tree shall not blossom, neither *shall* fruit *be* in the vines; the labour of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat; the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and *there shall be* no herd in the stalls: ¹⁸ Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation.

2. THE CONSTANCY OF JOY

Philippians 2:5 (KJV)

⁵ Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:

A. His Joy Remains as We Focus on His Word

James 1:8 (KJV)

⁸ A double minded man *is* unstable in all his ways.

One of the reasons that Christians struggle with consistent joy is a lack of stability and double mindedness.

B. His Joy Remains as We Follow His Will

C. His Joy Remains as We Have Faith in His Way.

Psalms 18:30 (KJV)

³⁰ As for God, his way is perfect: the word of the LORD is tried: he is a buckler to all those that trust in him.

3. THE COMPLETENESS OF HIS JOY

A. You Joy Might Be Full

Nehemiah 8:10 (KJV)

¹⁰ Then he said unto them, Go your way, eat the fat, and drink the sweet, and send portions unto them for whom nothing is prepared: for *this* day *is* holy unto our Lord: neither be ye sorry; for the joy of the LORD is your strength.

Psalms 16:11 (KJV)

¹¹ Thou wilt shew me the path of life: <u>in thy presence is fulness of joy</u>; at thy right hand *there are* pleasures for evermore.
