# **1. THANKFUL PEOPLE REJOICE IN WHAT THEY HAVE**

#### Hebrews 13:5

<sup>5</sup> Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee.

 Paul was content because he was continually thankful

#### 1 Thessalonians 5:18

<sup>18</sup> In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.

• A thankful heart made him content.

#### Philippians 4:11-12

<sup>11</sup> Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, *therewith* to be content. <sup>12</sup> I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound: every where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need.

His contentment wasn't based on what he had.

#### Philippians 4:12

<sup>12</sup> I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound:

every where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need.

• Christ was what made him content.

#### Philippians 4:13

<sup>13</sup> I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.

Thankful people recognize that all things are temporary.

### **2. THANKFUL PEOPLE REFUSE TO BE RULED BY WHAT THEY DON'T HAVE**

- That leads to often to the Devil's trap.
- The love of money is the root of all evil.

#### 1 Timothy 6:10

<sup>10</sup> For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows.

The love of money cost the rich young ruler his soul.

#### Luke 18:18-23

<sup>18</sup> And a certain ruler asked him, saying, Good Master, what shall

I do to inherit eternal life? <sup>19</sup> And Jesus said unto him, Why callest thou me good? none *is* good, save one, *that is*, God. <sup>20</sup> Thou knowest the commandments, Do not commit adultery, Do not kill, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Honour thy father and thy mother. <sup>21</sup> And he said, All these have I kept from my youth up. <sup>22</sup> Now when Jesus heard these things, he said unto him, Yet lackest thou one thing: sell all that thou hast, and distribute unto the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, follow me. <sup>23</sup> And when he heard this, he was very sorrowful: for he was very rich.
