3. THEIR CHARACTER

A. The Priest.

1. Is a picture of one that only serves God in church

a. Passed by on the others side (vs31)

1. The priest was a servant of the law as was the lawyer.

b. Didn't even stop to check if he was dead or alive

c. He left God in the temple

B. The Levite

1. Is a picture of those in the church that sees the need but do nothing about it

a. Came and looked on him and passed by on the other side.(vs32)

2. The Levite was a servant in the church as well

a. All priests were Levites but all Levites were not priest.

b. Was probably in the wrong more than the priest because he did know what was going on.

c. He too left God in the temple.

C. The Samaritan

1. Is a picture of Jesus, and true Christianity?

a. Samaritans were aliens, as is Jesus Christ being from Heaven.

b. Samaritans were hated by the Jews, as was Jesus.

d. The Samaritan had compassion on the traveler, as does Jesus on the poor undone sinner, wounded and stripped by sin.
