EVERY DAY WILL I BLESS THEE

PSALMS 145

Text: Psalms 145:2

Psalm 145:2

² Every day will I bless thee; and I will praise thy name for ever and ever.

Introduction:

Spurgeon once said, “Praise is the rehearsal of our eternal song.”

The chief purpose of the believers, both now and throughout the ages, is the pursuit of the glory of God.

Praising and practicing the greatness of God should be the primary passion of God's people all day, every day.

Psalms 145 is a summons to every believer to practice this pursuit – the unending praise of God.

This is the last of David’s psalms.

Is almost as if David saved the best to last.

Notice:

Sermon Content:

1. A PRAISE FOR GOD'S GREATNESS (VS. 1-6)

Truly God is great.

Job stated it this way:

Job 36:26

²⁶ Behold, God is great, and we know him not, neither can the number of his years be searched out.

Note:

A. Determined Praise (vs. 1)

Psalm 145:1

¹ I will extol thee, my God, O king; and I will bless thy name for ever and ever.

This was a vow to praise the Lord.

This praise was a purposeful choice of David.

This praise flowed from a personal relationship and a perpetual fellowship with the Lord.

Note not only a Determined Praise but also:

B. Daily Praise (vs. 2)

Psalm 145:2

² Every day will I bless thee; and I will praise thy name for ever and ever.

Worship is to be a daily lifestyle for the believer.

Every day, whether in good or bad times, I will praise God, expressing love and devotion for him.

This is one earthly occupation that will continue for ever and ever.

As we consider our praise for the Lord, are we determined to praise Him daily?

Certainly there should be Praise for God's Greatness but also there should be:

2. PRAISE FOR GOD'S GOODNESS (VS. 7-10)

Psalm 145:7-10

⁷ They shall abundantly utter the memory of thy great goodness, and shall sing of thy righteousness. ⁸ The LORD is gracious, and full of compassion; slow to anger, and of great mercy. ⁹ The LORD is good to all: and his tender mercies are over all his works. ¹⁰ All thy works shall praise thee, O LORD; and thy saints shall bless thee.

Notice the items David mentioned regarding God's goodness:

- The Lord is Gracious
- The Lord is Full of Compassion
- The Lord is Slow to Anger
- The Lord Demonstrates Great Mercy
- The Lord is Good to All
- The Lord Shows Tender Mercy Over All His Works

These things should cause us to praise Him as well.
