Text: 2 Corinthians 5:17

#### 2 Corinthians 5:17

<sup>17</sup> Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

#### Introduction:

Note these words – "All things are become new."

I'm not opposed to the old-time religion.

Everything that we have in America that is worth having, is due to that old-time religion.

Those people who came to this country came to this country primarily seeking God.

If you read the Constitution, you find that, written in the Constitution—if you read our history, you can find it written large in our history, you can find it stamped upon our money—America is great, because America is a country, based on biblical principles because of the faith of that old-time religion.

Less than one percent of the population, in 1776, were not members of a Protestant church.

These people believed in God.

That is the atmosphere out of which we've come.

Now, let's talk about our progress in America.

We've split the atom; we've walked on the moon; we've made great strides in the medicine, and yet we are deeper problems than we've ever been.

But I submit that the old time religion is also the new time religion.

### 1. MEANS OF A NEW CREATURE (VS. 15) - "IN CHRIST"

### 2 Corinthians 5:17

### 2. MEASURE OF A NEW CREATURE (VS. 15) - "ALL THINGS ARE BECOME NEW"
